**I wish to strongly Object on my own behalf citing the above precedent, and make representation by stating my own personal reasons for Objecting to permanent prohibition of parking on all BOATS in the WHS Stonehenge. The main Objection stems from the lack of disabled access, transport and facilities available during "out of normal visiting hours during managed open access days" and times specified and agreed with English Heritage for the purposes of sacred and holy ceremonial rituals.**

**2.) I object on the grounds that closure of the road from BOAT woodford 16 to darrington 10 and BOAT Wilsford cum lake 2 to the A303, ( to anything but emergency, maintenance, pedestrians and horses) will effectively seal off any chance of anyone parking near Stonehenge without paying English Heritage to do so. People have been parking on the section, BOAT amesbury 12 otherwise known as 'The Drove' for a very long time. There has been absolutely no trouble and it has allowed people to be close to their spiritual centre..stonehenge, without being surrounded by tourists and officials for a long time. On the Drove we can meet and feel the energy from our sacred spot. We can leave feeling rejuvenated and refreshed and spiritually energised again.**
