Having read most of the documentation relating to the T.R.O. proposed at "W.H.S. at Stonehenge, Amesbury," I am worried and feel the need to question/object to the following points.

When observing religious rites (on a 24 hour, or sun-up to sun-down, quarterly attendances) it is already an inconvenient, and even painful experience to attend, with parking on the "B.O.A.T.s" being far from ideal, but the "overseeing authority" do not, open the carparks, even for the sick or disabled pilgrims!
